The government is investing £50 million over the next three years into the U.K vehicle manufacturing industry to support manufactures and improve productivity. If more cars are being produced in the UK, then more motor vehicle engineers will be required to maintain and repair them.

Why study this course?

- Work on systems relating to the engine, transmission, electrical, braking, and steering and suspension. Also carry out routine servicing inspections and when qualified the annual MOT testing of vehicles and advise customers on their condition.

Who is the course aimed at?

- This course is aimed at students who are looking to gain the underpinning knowledge and skills needed to pursue a career in the Motor Vehicle industry.

What will you study?

- Servicing and valeting
- Engine units and components
 - Lubrication and cooling systems
 - Fuel and air systems
 - Ignition systems
- Replacing engine chassis units
- Transmission and driveline components
- Vehicle inspections
- Fault diagnosis

Knowledge and Skills you will develop

- Maintenance and repair of vehicle systems listed above
- Customer service
- Understanding on day to day running of the garage

Behaviours you will develop

- Knowledge of supporting job roles, team working
- Organisational structure

Entry requirements

- You will need to complete initial assessments in maths and English and take part in an interview with a member of our Assessment Team.
- You will need to be working in an environment that will provide you with the opportunities to learn and develop your vehicle maintenance and repair skills. (Minimum entry 3 required to work towards Level 1).

How long will it last?

- 21 months

How will it be delivered

- You will attend college one day per week and be assessed in the workplace.
- Maths and English development will run parallel with assessments.
- Employment Rights and Responsibilities will be embedded into the NVQ delivery.

Qualifications gained

- Level 2 Diploma in Light Vehicle Maintenance and Repair Competence
- Level 2 Diploma in Light Vehicle Maintenance and Repair Principles
- •Level 1 as a minimum for Maths, English and ICT development
- City and Guilds Level 2 Award in Knowledge of Employee Rights and Responsibilities for the Automotive Sector.

Progression to further study

- You will be able to progress to the Advanced Apprenticeship in Vehicle Maintenance and Repair.
