# Who is the course aimed at?

The course is aimed at care support workers in the following sectors:

- + Domiciliary care
- + Residential care
- + Day care provision
- + CP Practices
- + Supported Living
- + Day Care Provision

#### What will you study

An example of the mandatory units covered include:

- + Promote communication in care settings
- + Promote effective handling of information in care settings
- + Duty of care in care settings
- + Safeguarding and Protection

Students will also cover optional units in a variety of specialist areas to tailor to the qualification.

# Knowledge and skills you will develop

Through completing this apprenticeship you will be able to:

- + Provide high quality, compassionate healthcare
- + Develop and implement risk assessment plans and carry out arange of clinical and non-clinical healthcare or therapeutic tasks
- + Demonstrate best practice and act as a role model and be able to guide and supervise less experienced staff
- + Follow the principles for equality and diversity and inclusion
- + Safeguard and protect adults.
- + Work as part of a team and learn the behaviours expected from a role model; the principles of training and mentoring
- + Understand the meaning of risk assessment and how to recognise hazards
- + Ensure that resources (materials and equipment) are used efficiently by ensuring correct use
- + Take responsibility for own development of skills and knowledge

#### Behaviours you will develop

- + Customer Focused: Considerate of the needs of users, duty of care
- + Collaborative: Able to work as part of a team and with a wide variety of health care professionals
- + Effective communicator:
  Ability to build relationships based on common understanding
- + Flexible: Capable of adapting to changing circumstances and expectations
- + Honest: Truthful in the dealings with service users and colleagues
- + Methodical: Detailed in the way they go about their work

#### **Entry requirements**

+ Learners should be at least 16 years old.

#### Maths and English

All learners in a Level 3 Apprenticeship will need to provide evidence of a minimum Level 2 in Maths and English (or equivalent) prior to entering EPA Cateway.

You will need to provide evidence of at least one Level 2 in Maths or English prior to starting on the Apprenticeship. You will need to attend sessions to achieve all required Level 2 Maths or English to be able to successfully enter in to your EPA Cateway.

#### How long will it last?

Typical duration: 18 months

#### How will it be delivered?

You will attend college taught sessions one day a week.

The competency requirements will largely be delivered within the workplace environment, via regular assessor visits and one to one tutorials.
